2. Review of Compliance Risks & Proposed Action Items for Input into the Compliance Action Plan (CAP)

The existing CAP is in Appendix 1 of CCSBT's Compliance Plan¹ and is now outdated², however at CC15 in 2020 it was agreed that revision of the CAP (to a 5-year plan) should not be considered until the next appropriate face-to-face meeting.

In 2022, CC17 agreed to convene a face-to-face meeting of TCWG prior to the Eighteenth Meeting of the Compliance Committee (CC18) to work on compliance risks and to provide input to the CAP.

Therefore, this agenda item is for Members to:

- Review, document and potentially prioritise compliance risks. Members should consider and update the list of compliance risks in the outdated CAP including considering the item raised by Australia at CC17 that the lack of observer data for reasons such as the COVID-19 pandemic is a risk that needs to be discussed³, and*
- Make recommendations to CC18 on proposed CAP action items (for 2024 to 2028) which both align with CCSBT's draft Strategic Plan (and Implementation Plan) agreed by SFMWG 6⁴ as well as address the identified list of compliance risks. Members should also take into consideration actions identified in the CCSBT Multi-Year Seabird Strategy (2022).*

Discuss any other technical matters submitted to the Secretariat by Members.

4. Recommendations to the Compliance Committee

Provide recommendations to CC18 regarding current compliance risks and associated proposed CAP action items to address the identified risks.
