Report from the CCSBT Observer (Republic of Korea) to the Nineteenth Regular Session of the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC) (Da Nang, Vietnam, 28 November-3 December, 2022)

- 1. The 19th Regular Session of the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission took place from 28 November to 3 December, 2022 in Da Nang, Vietnam. 31 Members & Participating Territories, Cooperating Non-Members (CNM) and a number of NGOs participated in the meeting.
- 2. WCPFC19 adopted, among others, the CMM on a Management Procedure for Skipjack Tuna, the Harvest Strategy for North Pacific Albacore, the CMM for North Pacific Swordfish and a revised CMM for Sharks.
- 3. WCPFC19 agreed on a Process to negotiate a revised Tropical Tuna Measure in 2023 and WCPFC20 will discuss the issue further this year.
- 4. WCPFC19 also agreed to include Climate Change as a standing agenda item and to prioritize discussion of how best to incorporate climate change information and analyses in its work.
- 5. WCPFC19 agreed to grant cooperating non-member status to Curação, El Salvador, Ecuador, Liberia, Nicaragua, Panama, Thailand and Vietnam for 2023.
- 6. No change was made to the WCPFC IUU Vessel List. Three existing vessels the Neptune, Fu Lien No.1 and Yu Fong 168 remained on the List.
- 7. Ms. Jung-re Riley Kim completed her term as the Commission Chair after 4 years' service. Dr. Josie Tamate from Niue and Mr. Fukuda Takumi from Japan were appointed as the new Commission Chair and Vice Chair, respectively.
- 8. Ms. Rhea Moss-Christian from the Republic of Marshall Islands was appointed as the new Executive Director of WCPFC.
- 9. It was agreed that WCPFC20 would be held in Rarotonga, Cook Islands in 2023.
- 10. There wasn't any discussion on CCSBT-related issues at WCPFC19.
