Executive Summary

The Commission established a programme to monitor transshipments at sea, which applies to large-scale tuna longline fishing vessels (LSTLVs) and carrier vessels authorized to receive transshipments at sea. Indonesia's longline fleet is dominated by wooden fishing vessels, including wooden carrier vessels. This fact has provided difficulties for Indonesian wooden carrier vessels to carry out transshipments at sea because regional observers could not be on board placed on this type of vessels due to safety reason.

In 2017, Indonesia proposed an exemption to allow Indonesian wooden carrier vessels to use national observers under a pilot project on transshipments at sea. The pilot project was reviewed and extended every two years by the IOTC Compliance Committee. Indonesia aims to integrate the pilot project into the Regional Observer Programme (ROP) by 2025.

The government of Indonesia has shown its persistent commitment to the implementation of Resolution 24/05 (and its predecessors) through the prescription and enforcement of relevant national laws and regulations. Resolution 24/05 is implemented under the Ministerial Regulation No. 10/2021 on Standards for Business Activities and Products in the Implementation of Risk-Based Business Licensing for the Marine and Fisheries Sector.

The wooden carrier vessels for transshipments at sea under the pilot project are needed for the following reasons:

- a. To maintain good quality fish which have an impact on the welfare of fishers and public revenues which are used as fisheries management costs;
- b. To provide faster distribution of food, medicines, spare part, and other supplies, and most importantly taking care of the crews' well-being by improving time of crews' exchange;
- c. To ease the burden of the long working days at sea;
- d. To ensure the mental health of the crew due to limited social interaction at sea, so that safe and comfortable working environment at sea can be provided including support of emergencies such as illness and personal matters.

The Government of Indonesia established a new working unit in mid 2023 to focus on the implementation of the observer scheme and observer program for transshipments at sea. The working unit and the IOTC Secretariat have closely communicated electronically to report and clarify any requirements under IOTC Resolutions. In reviewing the implementation of the pilot project in the period 2023-2024, Indonesia conducted consultation session with the IOTC Secretariat and the Senior MCS Consultant.

The pilot project is aiming to be integrated into the ROP by 2025, thus it would be the last extension period for the pilot project. This review shall include whether the programme offers the same level of assurances as those provided by the ROP. Information and data collected by Indonesia as part of the pilot project relating to the transshipment of southern bluefin tuna will be shared with the Commission for the Conservation of Southern Bluefin Tuna, consistent with existing IOTC sharing arrangements under the CCBST/ IOTC MOU.

1. Purpose of this paper

This paper is presented to provide information of the implementation of Indonesia – Two Years Pilot Project 2023 / 2024 on the Monitoring Transshipment at Sea.

2. Background

The Commission established a programme to monitor transshipments at sea, which applies to large-scale tuna longline fishing vessels (LSTLVs) and carrier vessels authorized to receive transshipments at sea. Indonesia's longline fleet is dominated by wooden fishing vessels, including wooden carrier vessels. This fact has provided difficulties for Indonesian wooden carrier vessels to carry out transshipments at sea because regional observers could not be on board placed on this type of vessels due to safety reason.

In 2017, Indonesia proposed an exemption to allow Indonesian wooden carrier vessels to use national observers under a pilot project on transshipments at sea. The pilot project was reviewed and extended every two years by the IOTC Compliance Committee. Indonesia aims to integrate the pilot project into the Regional Observer Programme (ROP) by 2025.

The government of Indonesia has shown its persistent commitment to the implementation of Resolution 24/05 (and its predecessors) through the prescription and enforcement of relevant national laws and regulations. Resolution 24/05 is implemented under the Ministerial Regulation No. 10/2021 on Standards for Business Activities and Products in the Implementation of Risk-Based Business Licensing for the Marine and Fisheries Sector.

The wooden carrier vessels for transshipments at sea under the pilot project are needed for the following reasons:

- a. To maintain good quality fish which have an impact on the welfare of fishers and public revenues which are used as fisheries management costs;
- b. To provide faster distribution of food, medicines, spare part, and other supplies, and most importantly taking care of the crews' well-being by improving time of crews' exchange;
- c. To ease the burden of the long working days at sea;
- d. To ensure the mental health of the crew due to limited social interaction at sea, so that safe and comfortable working environment at sea can be provided including support of emergencies such as illness and personal matters.

Indonesia's implementation of the pilot project since 2019 may be summarized as follows:

- a. In 2019, one of the Indonesian wooden carrier vessels listed in Annex V of Resolution 19/06 was authorized to conduct transshipments at sea.
- b. In 2020, two vessels listed in Annex V conducted transshipments on the high seas.
- c. In 2021, of twelve vessels listed in Annex V of Resolution 21/02, nine vessels were conducting transshipments at sea. In December 2021, Indonesia proposed a replacement of three vessels because they were no longer suitable for transporting tuna products.
- d. In April 2022, a significant increase in fuel price caused an increase in the operating cost of Indonesian vessels. As a result, a sufficiently large number of carrier vessels in operation is needed to reduce overall fuel costs while simultaneously maintaining the required quality of fish products. Therefore, Indonesia proposed to add five wooden

carrier vessels to the pilot project and this proposal was adopted. In 2022, of seventeen vessels listed in Annex VI of Resolution 22/02, eleven vessels were conducting transshipments at sea.

- e. In 2023, of seventeen vessels listed in Annex VI of Resolution 22/02 and Resolution 23/05, all the vessels were conducting transshipments at sea. In October 2023, one vessel was replaced by another vessel with a smaller capacity or GT. The replacement of the vessel was due to a fire incident that occurred on the vessel.

3. The Implementation of the Pilot Project

3.1. The Consultation Stage

To follow up the extension of Indonesia Transshipment Pilot Project, Indonesia informs the progress as follow:

- a. Established working unit for specifically handling observers in June 2023
- b. Indonesia conducted consultation with the IOTC Secretariat and the CCSBT Secretariat for three times as in the following:
 - 1. on 31st October – 1st November 2024 to discuss the IOTC ROP Standard in terms of the compliance improvement.
 - 2. on 11th December 2024 to discuss the result of IOTC Secretariat's evaluation on the implementation of Indonesia Transshipment Pilot Project.
 - 3. on 14th January 2025 particularly to discuss Pilot Project Database.
- c. Indonesia conducted consultation with Senior MCS Consultant – FAO (Mr. Glenn D. Quelch) on 30th January 2025 to discuss questionnaire regarding the alignment of Indonesia's Pilot Project, desk review follow-up questions, and briefing note regarding filed visit to Indonesia in connection with the IOTC independent assessment of Indonesia's pilot programme to monitor transshipments.
- d. Meeting coordination among government, association, and company owner of the Carrier Vessels on 22nd November 2024, 21st January 2025, and 31st January 2025.
- e. Reviewing the result of implementation of pilot project, on 23rd – 24th February 2024, 26th – 27th March 2024, and 5th – 6th November 2024.

3.2. The Progress of the Implementation

- 3.2.1 Requirement on Fleets provide list of CVs authorized to receive tuna and tuna-like species and sharks.

In 2023, there are 17 Indonesian carrier vessels registered in the IOTC Record of Authorised Vessels (RAV). All of them are included in the list of Annex VI of Resolution 23/05, which are Bandar Nelayan 2017, Permata Tuna Wijaya 01, Hiroyoshi - 17, Kilat Maju Jaya - 21, Bandar Nelayan 271, Perintis Jaya - 36, Nusantara Jaya -12, Naga Mas Perkasa 89, Bandar Nelayan 519, Mutiara 36, Bahari – 116, Golden Tuna 99, Bahari Nusantara, Bandar Nelayan 2018, Bandar Nelayan 308, Bandar Nelayan 2023, Bahari 89.

There were 14 carrier vessels conducted transshipment both in EEZ and high sea. There are 19 Requests submitted to the IOTC Secretariat. List of Carrier vessels as in the table below:

Indonesia has submitted and updated list of observers to the IOTC Secretariat every time there was any new request of observer deployment.

In November 2023, Indonesia submitted 87 observers to the IOTC Secretariat, however, at the end of 2023 there were 18 observers who resigned so that by the end of 2023 the number of observers were 69 people. In mid-2024 there were 25 observers who resigned because they passed the State Civil Apparatus so that the number of observers at the end of 2024 was 44 observers. 3.2.6 Requirement on Deployment Request Approved by the Secretariat.

Indonesia has submitted deployment request to the IOTC Secretariat every time there was any new request of observer deployment.

3.2.7 Requirement on The Observer Onboard CV

Observer checked/inspected each fishing vessel and monitored the transshipment operations and has submitted the report to the Flag State to be evaluated.

3.2.8 Requirement on Submission of 5 Days Reports

Indonesia has submitted 5 days reports. However, the observer cannot submit on time because the electronic reporting system to submit the reports on carrier vessels are not available. They tried to use Radio, but sometimes became delay because of weather condition. For the improvement, Indonesia conducted a trial of satellite communication equipment through Starlink to report directly from the carrier vessel. The satellite communication equipment has been tested for 2 vessels in Benoa.

3.2.9 Requirement on Pre-transshipment Notification.

Before every transshipment, Owner/Operator/Master of fishing vessel submitted pre-transshipment notification to the Port Authority by Radio Call.

The Owner/Operator/Master of CV submitted transshipment declaration to Flag State and Secretariat, however, it cannot be submitted on time because the electronic reporting system not available on board. They tried to use Radio, but sometimes became delay because of weather condition. For the improvement, Indonesia conducted a trial of satellite communication equipment through Starlink to report directly from the carrier vessel. The satellite communication equipment has been tested for 2 vessels in Benoa.
