## REPORT FROM THE CCSBT OBSERVER TO NINETEENTH SESSION OF INDIAN OCEAN TUNA COMMISSION (IOTC)

(27 April – 1 May 2015, Busan, Republic of Korea)

CCSBT Observer (Indonesia)

 The Nineteenth Session of the Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC) was held in Busan, Korea, from 27 April to 1 May 2015. Delegates from 32 Members of the Commission, 1 cooperating non-Contracting Parties, 10 Observers (including invited experts) have attended the Session.

## **Cooperation between IOTC and CCSBT**

2. No matter related to cooperation between IOTC and CCSBT was discussed during the meeting.

## **Other Issues**

- 4. Based on Annual Contractor Report on IOTC Regional Observer Program during 2014, it was reported but not discussed that one observer (deployment 298/14 on Sea Mansion) had seen Southern Bluefin Tuna transshipped by two LSTLVs (Ray Home and Shunn Perng 202) that were not otherwise recorded in the transshipment Declaration or Catch Monitoring Form.
- 5. The 20<sup>th</sup> session of IOTC will be held in La Reunion, France in May 2016, and 21<sup>st</sup> will be held in in Bali in April 2017.
